PASTOR'S PAGE...

Dear Friedens Family,

October is here with harvest in full swing and the holiday season on our doorstep.

As we travel along Interstate 80 we see farmers in the fields and an increasing number of fields that are harvested. It reminds me of a native thanksgiving prayer that thanks God that we have seeds to sow, that the rain continues to water the plants, and that the fields continue to feed the seeds until the harvest comes. In the Biblical story, some fields produce 30 fold, some 60 fold, and some 100 fold. In our story, the fields more likely produce some 100 fold, some 500 fold, and some 1000 fold. We thank God for food to eat, and we pray that we will seek ways to feed all people with this bountiful harvest.

Of course, the Biblical story is not just about God's faithfulness to us in providing food, but about our faithfulness in sowing the seeds of God's word to fulfill God's desire to gather people into his eternal family.

The month of October brings to mind pumpkins, jack-o-lanterns and pumpkin pie. It brings out the child in me. Our first holiday of the season is "All Hallows Eve" (halloween) followed by All Saints Day. Once again, we will remember those who have died: in our congregation, in our families, and in our neighborhood. This year we will remember the 200,000+ who have died from the Covid-19 virus in our country, and millions more around the world. As we remember, we pray that our scientists will find ways to battle this disease more effectively so we can have a better year next year. God help us!

I hope we don't grow callous from hearing, day after day, the new numbers of those infected and those who have died. It registered with me in a new way when I heard that my 90 year old sister had tested positive for the virus. To our surprise, and our delight, she is home and doing well! That's "Good News!"

But, that Good News is small compared to the Good News that God has won for all people: a victory over sin and death through the death of Jesus our Savior and his amazing resurrection. We keep celebrating!

Our theme verse for last summer from Psalm 100:5 says, "For the Lord is good; His steadfast love endures forever, and His faithfulness continues through all generations."



Summary of Council Meeting, September 17, 2020

The meeting was called to order by President, Gary Hardt, followed by a prayer by Pastor Bud. There were seven members in attendance. The Secretary and Treasurer reports were approved as presented.

Pastor Bud thanked everyone who has helped keep our services going during the pandemic. He has received many compliments on the Facebook streaming services. He is looking ahead to the German Service and asking for suggestions for someone to do the German part of that service.

Gary reported that he is still working with the architect regarding construction of a new elevator. Cheever Construction is willing to bid the project once we are sure what our plan will be, and when we have funding. We will need to do some fundraising. We need to look at other sources of funding, such as the Kraft Grant through the ELCA.

Pastor Bud's Transitional Ministry Agreement will expire 11/1/2020. Pastor Bud gave his approval to extend his contract.

Gary reported that our wedding policy needs to be updated. Pastor and Gary will investigate this and review what other Churches are doing and the fees that they charge.

The Boys and Girls Club has proposed to use Friedens fellowship hall, should the pandemic close schools. They have responded to several questions, including insurance, child to adult ratios, hours of operation, use of the kitchen, etc. At this time, we will wait to see if this situation will come about.

The laptop used for livestreaming our service is incredibly old and slow. Gary will investigate the specifications that we need and the cost.

Kathy Rempe reported that the annual Halloween Party will not be held this year due to COVID-19.

Irene Newhouse reported that Friedens hosted an OLLI (Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at UNL) presentation with the American Historical Society of Germans from Russia on "Faith and Family" on September 15. Karen Scribner and Irene Newhouse did the presentation and tour of the Church. It was well received.

Gary Hardt, president, adjourned the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.
