Dear Friedens Family,

Happy Easter! Fifty days of the Easter Season are flying by. Easter will end when Pentecost begins on May 28. It is always fifty days after Easter Sunday.

As we have noticed during our worship, the first Easter Season was a time of joy and a time of hardship for the early believers. Some of the believers met Jesus in person, but they didn't recognize him. While he was with them on earth he was another human being. But they knew he was someone very special by the things he did and the way he taught them. Early on he was condemned by the religious leaders for blasphemy. He was driven out of the synagogue in his home town of Nazareth and his neighbors tried to kill him.

Very soon Rome became concerned and watched him carefully because they feared he may cause trouble. He and his disciples hid out in the hills of Galilee. Jesus made occasional appearances, gathering crowds, teaching them and performing miracles for the people that were brought to him.

He, very intentionally, rode into the hostile city of Jerusalem to face his accusers. They appeared to win as he was tried, condemned and crucified as a common criminal. Pilate, the Roman judge who consented to his execution, worried that he might be a king. However, he was no threat to Caesar because he was the King of kings, and Lord of lords!

The believers watched him die, but they didn't realize he was destroying the power of death.

They met him alive, but in a new form. When he came to earth, born of the Virgin Mary, he had given up his place with his Father. Now he had returned to the heavenly realm to live and reign for all eternity. He came to visit and to instruct his followers. "Stay in Jerusalem until you receive a gift from God."

They did and life was risky for them. They were still Jews, but they were believing Jews. They were not to utter the name of Jesus in public. Plans were made to eradicate believers from the earth.

Then it happened! Pentecost! At a Jewish holiday in Jerusalem when the city was filled with pilgrims the sound of a mighty wind filled the city. The Spirit of Jesus (God) filled them all and they began to do what was forbidden. They spoke the name of Jesus. They told of his mighty deeds. They spoke in all the languages of people who were there from many nations. As Peter, who had denied Jesus, now spoke boldly, many became believers and were baptized.

The Church was on its way! Hallelujah! And as we go on our way, Christ goes with us!



If you are looking for a worthwhile project to donate to, we are going to have some repairs done to the exterior of all 4 sides of our bell tower. We have had some wind damage to those areas, and if we don't get the repairs done now, it can lead to more extension repairs in the future. Trying to keep this 116 year old building in good shape requires constant maintenance, and that is something that we haven't always been able to keep up with. The estimate for repairs is around \$4,000. It will require a lift for the workers to get up there to do the repairs. If you would like to donate to this project, you can send a check to the office and mark it "exterior siding repairs". Or you can drop a check in the offering plate with the same information on the memo line. This has happened over a period of time, and it is to the point now where we need to make the repairs to the building. Thank you



South Salt Creek Community Organization Update

The South Salt Creek Community Organization (SSCCO) meets at Friedens on the second Monday of the month at 7:00 PM. Meetings are open to all residents within the South Salt Creek area. Currently Kathy Holland serves as the host to this group, representing Friedens. Other supporting organizations whose representatives attend include the Germans from Russia Museum (AHSGR), Immanuel Lutheran Church at 11th & Plum Streets, and Community Learning Center partners from neighboring schools.

SSCCO has been instrumental in providing input to guide the renovations to Cooper Park, Lincoln's oldest park. The first phase of these improvements is nearly complete. LED lighting has been added. The northwest corner now has a shared school/community use playfield, a tennis court and two pickle ball courts. Work continues on a new entry plaza off of D St (across from 7th St.) with columns and an arch donated by TMCO Manufacturing. New sidewalks on the south and east sides of the park have been installed. Brick pillars on all four corners of the park have been installed. Yet to be completed is repair/removal of the stone landscaping along the west side.

SSCCO has also been working with the City Planning Department to replace the South Bottoms Historic District signs.

What is the SCRIP PROGRAM?

Scrip fundraising, now called RaiseRight, is a program that generates earnings from retailers, restaurants, fast food places; local and chain stores. Companies donate a percentage of your purchase of gift cards back to the fundraising organization. For example, Don & Millies donates 18% of the cost of a gift card. Purchase a \$10 card and \$1.80 goes to Friedens. Other retailers may not be as generous but, say you purchase 3, \$100 gift cards from Russ's Market, \$9.00 will be returned to the church. Many of those who participate in the RaiseRight (Scrip) program, purchase cards they know they will use consistently throughout the month, for example, grocery store gift cards.

Earnings through the **RaiseRight** (Scrip) program are designated for the general fund. Since the beginning of 2023, our small group of **RaiseRight** (Scrip) participants have raised \$170.00.

If you are interested in participating, you will find order forms in the entry way to the church. The form lists available cards, the denominations that are available and the percentage earned. Once you select the cards you would like to purchase, please give your order form and payment to the **RaiseRight** organizer, Kathy Holland. Orders are taken the 2nd Sunday of the month and cards are distributed the 3rd Sunday of the month.
