



No Council members are going off Church Council this year so no Council election was necessary. Mark Grimes was elected to the Endowment Committee to replace Jim Plucknett who has moved to Florida. With the uncertainty as to whether Synod Assembly will be held this year, the election of Synod Assembly delegates was deferred until plans are made known.

Irene Newhouse reviewed the proposed budget for 2021. The budget was approved as proposed with expected income of \$120,510.00 and projected expenditures of \$110,278.00, a difference of approximately \$10,000.00.

A statement of thanks for Pastor Bud's efforts in making Friedens worship services unique & engaging and for his patience, faithfulness & guidance in leading our congregation was unanimously agreed upon. In turn, Pastor Bud thanked everyone for their cooperation and willingness to keep working in any way possible through the pandemic in order to do God's work for each other and for our neighborhood.

The meeting was adjourned following the approval of the Resolutions and was concluded with the Lord's Prayer.
