Julie and her "Sunday school Elves" are busy providing fun learning experiences for the children. We see them serving on Communion Sundays and look forward with them to the seasons ahead.



We, as a church, make a small but important difference to those who come to visit, to shop, to eat, and just get baked goodies.


People love us and we love them. God shows his love thru us to them.




